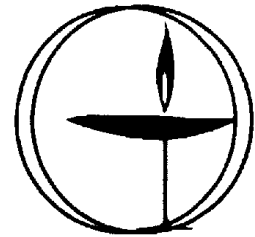

Social Responsibility

In a letter from Crossway Community, CEO Kathleen Guinan tells about the successes of this year. “Three single mothers in the Family Leadership School have earned their GEDs; seventeen mothers are now enrolled in college and working on degrees; eighteen mothers either landed a new job or continued gainful employment; and two mothers learned to drive. Beyond that, hundreds of nutritious meals were prepared, children slept safely in their own beds and babies and children enjoyed a first-rate Montessori education. More than two hundred young women attended our prevention classes. ESOL classes were offered to fifty-two adults. Hundreds of neighbors enjoyed our community center.” The Alliance donated \$500 to this worthy organization last year.
