June Program: A Language of Resistance and Liberation—In song & spoken word



Join us as our very own Steve Jones and Pam Parker take us on a journey through some of the strands that created Jazz: the sacred, the profane, and the

powerful human drive for freedom. Steve and Pam will touch on how jazz has transformed our culture, influenced how we interact as a society, and even how it has impacted theology. Steve



Jones is an award-winning composer of two Jazz operas. He has performed at Blues Alley and in music festivals in Ireland, Switzerland, and Portugal. Steve is also the piano accompanist for the D.C. labor chorus. He was Composer in Residence at Macalester College where students performed his show--*Forgotten: The Murder at the Ford Rouge Plant*--about union organizing. Together with Elise Bryant, he created the musical *Love Songs From the Liberation Wars: The 1940s Tobacco Workers Struggle*. Joining Steve, will be talented Jazz vocalist Pam Parker. Steve has recorded with Pam, who starred in both operas. It's been said that her style "blends Billie's precision with Aretha's brand of soul." (Cont'd)

Pam's exquisite, classic voice has been thrilling crowds in our area for many years. According to *Express Night Out*, Pam's voice is "a combination of sweet tone, spot on vibrato and something hauntingly reminiscent of jazz singers of old." Don't miss our June program; we are in for a rare treat.

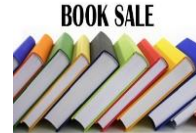
September 7:
